

## FULLNESS OF GOD IN CHRIST PT. 2

**For of [from] His fullness we have all received, grace for [upon] grace [...] For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him (John 1:16; Colossians 2:9-10a).**

It pleases the Lord Jesus to live in the Church, His Body by His Spirit! I want to fully apprehend this reality and revelation! It is rather overwhelming to think that all of the Omnipresent God is in a human body in Christ!
